A college professor, coach, author, and firm believer in the power of prayer, Glenn had a vision to create a spiritual training ground where we could come together as "athletes of the spirit" to renew mind, body and soul, steep ourselves in prayer, and go farther out in our individual relationships with God. Prayer is at the heart of the JFO experience: silent prayer, spoken prayer, individual prayer and group prayer. Geneva Point Center is now charging per person rather than per cabin or room. The per person rate includes meals and housing based on occupancy. Because this is new we have included simple steps to figure out your costs. See insert for rates. If you need help, please contact the registrars.

1. Where are you staying? Look at the chart to find your accommodation.
2. How many people are in your cabin or room? Look down the chart in the first row to find your adult (age 17+) occupancy rate. Rates are per person based on occupancy.
3. Note that there are also charges for children and youth.
4. How long are you staying? Look across the chart for the total number of nights.
5. Linen rates are at the bottom of the chart.

Special diets: Special medical dietary needs can be accommodated only with advance written request to the registrar. Other diets will not be available. **Gluten free and vegan add \$4.00 per meal.**

ADDITIONAL RATE INFORMATION

- There is no charge for children under age 3. Guests must bring their own crib.
- We are unable to reduce rates or give refunds if you arrive later or depart earlier than your registration indicates.
- Charges are payable by check to Winni JFO. Full payment is due to the registrars by July 1, 2024.
- Day visitors must give **advance notice** before arrival. They will pay Winni JFO a \$20 per day registration fee. **Payment to GPC for day use and meals must be made directly at the GPC office.**

CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Winni JFO is a family camp. We offer organized activities for children from preschool (age 4) through high school. All children and youth are expected to participate in the total camp program, including planned activities for their age group. Parents are responsible for children and youth at all times.

Health form required: Any person under age 18 who is at camp without a parent or legal guardian must provide a completed health form signed by a doctor. Request a form from the registrar at **winni.registrar@gmail.com** and submit it back to them by July 1.

WHAT TO BRING, WHAT NOT TO BRING

Bring flashlights, swimsuits, hot weather apparel, comfortable shoes, rainwear, and a sweater or jacket. Most importantly, bring an open heart, an open mind, and joyful expectancy!

For the safety of small children and our older campers, bicycles and other wheeled recreational vehicles may not be used on campus. Also, no pets are allowed on campus.

Registration begins at 3 PM on July 27. Please do not arrive earlier, as other groups are leaving and the GPC staff is preparing our rooms. Camp ends after breakfast on Aug. 3.
